



The Bucket Chair

In the previous newsletter, the bucket stander was highlighted. This newsletter will highlight how a 5-gallon bucket can also be used to fabricate a chair. The bucket chair provides an alternative to being held or laying on a bed or flat surface all day. Once the child has a proper seating system available, the parents and caregivers can more efficiently complete daily living activities. It also allows the child to engage in her environment assisting in development of motor and visual skills.

The 5-gallon bucket can be utilized to fabricate various types of chairs. For those that need less support, the front of the bucket is simply cut out and then padding, straps, and a base are added. For those that need ex-



tra support, lateral supports, head rests, abduction blocks, foot rests and straps, etc. can be added to the bucket to provide the best support possible. Trays can also be fabricated that fit around the bucket to allow the child to use her hands for play or feeding tasks. Certain cases/diagnosis require extra adaptations to achieve the best alignment possible. For example, a common diagnosis in Haiti is hydrocephaly. Oftentimes, the circumference and weight of the head will result in neck hyperextension impacting not only the head/neck alignment, but the trunk alignment as well. When fabricating a bucket chair for a child with hydrocephaly the head support needs to accommodate for this and needs to be attached further back on the chair while providing a comfortable, soft surface for the base of the head to rest on.
